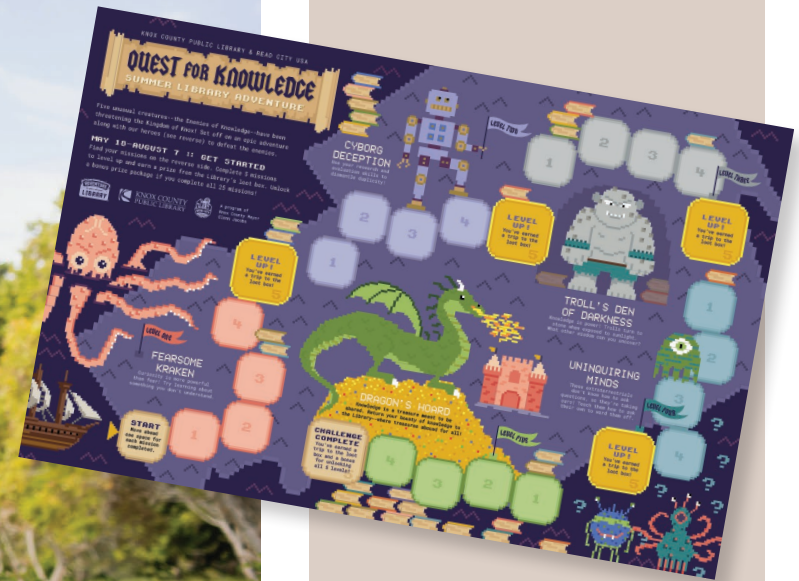

Libraries—the stuff of legends



Summer reading is a beloved (and research-backed!) program that engages school-aged children and readers of all ages in delightful enrichment activities during the summer months, when scholastic pursuits—and their gains—tend to slide. But summer reading isn't academic, it's adventurous! And this summer, it's truly epic.

The *Quest for Knowledge Summer Library Adventure* puts a spotlight on fantasy and science-fiction genres. These epic genres host some of our most beloved literary figures and legendary worlds—from Narnia to Tatooine, Hogwarts to planet Arrakis. Travel back to Ancient Greece, flash forward tens of thousands of years, or stop anywhere in between—1984? 2001? No matter where you trek, we challenge you to fill your imaginations with legends, myths, lore, and adventure.

Read on to explore the elements of the summer library Quest!

1. ZERO TO HERO

Every quest needs a hero. In this journey, that's you! Role-play as a superhero, knight, queen, or unicorn.

Pick up an avatar craft sheet at any library to build your own character.

2. OBJECTIVE(LY) SPEAKING

Stop at nothing until you complete 25 missions, including reading, listening, crafting, and playing. Choose any combination of missions, found on the back of your gameboard.

Pick up a *Quest for Knowledge* gameboard at any library location to begin tracking your missions, or join the challenge in Beanstack.

3. TROUBLE AHEAD

A quest's hero will inevitably meet with some obstacles along the way. Don't let the enemies of knowledge—creatures like a kraken, troll, and dragon—deter you from your quest.

Win over the enemies with your assets like curiosity, inquisitiveness, and benevolence!

4. A HERO'S REWARD

Lucky for you, it's the year of the dragon—you're destined for success! Every time you complete five missions, earn a dip in the Library's loot box. Kids and teens who complete all 25 missions earn a hero's reward pack with even more adventures and treats.

Return to any Library by August 7 to collect your riches!

To join the summer library adventure, pick up a *Quest for Knowledge* gameboard at any library location. Play now through August 7.

Optional: Join the challenge in Beanstack to track on your device.

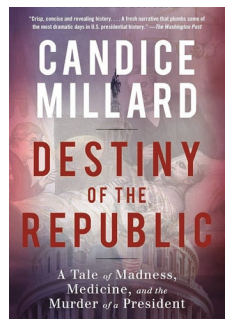

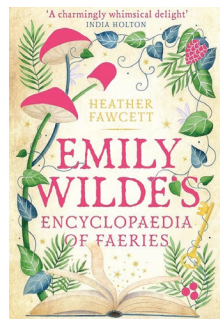


MON JUN 10 **All Over the Page**

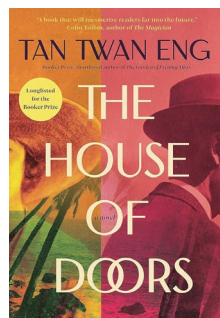
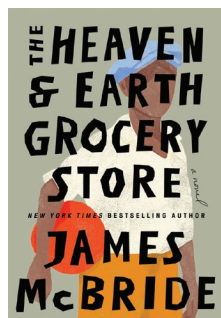
MON JUN 17 **Evening Reads**

Viewers are encouraged to stay after the screening to discuss the film. Then browse our Sights & Sounds collection to take home a few films until our next screening!



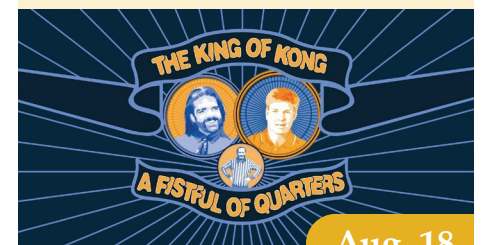
Jun. 16
